# Oceano Fire Department



## REPORT for February 2010

During the month of February, the department responded to a total of 43 calls. 27 were in Oceano, 4 were in Grover Beach, 4 were in Arroyo Grande, 7 were with Cal Fire and 1 call on the beach. Of the 27 calls in Oceano, 19 were EMS related, 2 fires and 6 miscellaneous calls. This averaged out to be 1.5 calls per day. The total run total for this year is 115; the run total at the end of last year was 125.

## Training

Joint training for the month of February included fire ground operations with the use of the ladder truck and patient and trauma assessments.


We are finishing up the cross training on the Oceano Dunes training with the Full Time captains at Arroyo Grande and Grover Beach. A few of them have one last session driving at night.

SUBJECT: 2010 FIREWORKS PROGRAM PERMITTING PROCESS AND FEES

- 1. The Board of Directors established their authority, through the adoption of Ordinance 1991-02, to regulate the fees and conditions for the granting of permits for the sale of safe and sane fireworks within the boundaries of the District. Thereafter, through the adoption of Resolution 1997-12, the Board of Directors limited the number of applicants to enhance the profit potential of each organization and therefore increase the return to the Community. Five organizations were recognized as authorized to submit application to the District to sell safe and sane fireworks; to wit: Oceano Depot Association, Oceano/Five Cities Elks No. 2504, Squad 745 (CHP), Five Cities Aerie No. 4153 F.O.E., and the South County Boys and Girls Club. During the 1999 Fireworks Program, the South County Boys and Girls Club opted not to participate, and the OCSD Board of Directors elected not to set into motion the defined procedure to replace the Boys and Girls Club with another participant. During the 2001 Fireworks Program, the Depot Association opted not to participate and the Oceano Firefighters' Association was authorized in lieu of the Depot Association to submit an application to sell safe and sane fireworks. The Firefighters' Association was granted continuing application authority by Resolution 2001-6.
- 2. It has been past practice to limit the number of participants to between four and six. This year under the recommendation of the Fire Chief Michael E. Hubert and for the increase safety of the residents. We would like to limit the number of participants to two (2).
- 3. In prior years, the Board of Directors elected to charge each participant a \$385 fee.
- 4. This year we would suggest the fee be \$500.00 because there will only be two.

THE RECOMMENDED ACTION BEFORE YOUR BOARD is to: by Board discussion, public comment, motion, second, and voice vote, direct staff to provide each of the designated organizations (Squad 745 [CHP]; Five Cities Aerie No. 4153 F.O.E.; Church of God of Prophecy; and Oceano Kiwanis Club) with an application form in which they may indicate:

- a. Their interest in participating in the safe and sane fireworks for 2009,
- b. How their profits in 2009 were used to benefit the Community, and,
- How they would use any revenues realized in 2010 for the betterment of the Oceano.

Applications must be received by the District no later than April 16, 2010.

**FURTHER,** by Board discussion, public comment, motion, second, and voice vote: confirm the administration/processing fee at \$500.00 payable at such time as the application is filed with the District.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF THE OCEANO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT
ADOPTING GUIDELINES FOR THE SUBMISSION AND TABULATION OF
PROTESTS IN CONNECTION WITH RATE HEARINGS
CONDUCTED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE XIIID, SECTION 6,
OF THE CALIFORNIA CONSTITUTION,
AND RELATED NOTICING

WHEREAS, Article XIIID, Section 6 of the California Constitution requires the Board of Directors of the Oceano Community Services District (OCSD) to consider written protests to certain proposed increases to utility charges; and

WHEREAS, this constitutional provision does not offer specific guidance as to who is allowed to submit protests, how written protests are to be submitted, or how the OCSD is to tabulate the protests; and

WHEREAS, for purposes of determining protests, Government Code Section 53755(b) provides for one written protest per parcel, and Government Code Section 53750(g) provides that identified parcels are those parcels that an agency has identified as a parcel upon which a proposed fee or charge is to be imposed; and

WHEREAS, to implement these provisions, and given the history of subdivision and development in Oceano, where the OCSD serves customers owning Assessor Parcel Numbers (APN) with more than one lot and the OCSD also serves customers with more than one APN, the attached Guidelines provide that a majority protest is to be determined based upon the number of parcels with active accounts served by the OCSD on the date of the public hearing, and defines "parcel" as a piece of land or property identified by Assessor's Parcel Number that is served by the OCSD, the owner of which is subject to the proposed charge; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the OCSD may direct the General Manager to mail notice of future proposed water charges and proposed wastewater charges, to each record owner of every parcel served by the OCSD, scheduling the rates protest hearings for a regular Broad Meeting the second or fourth Wednesday of a month at least 60 days after, at Oceano Community Services District, at 6:30 pm, 1655 Front Street, Oceano, CA; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the OCSD hereby adopts the Guidelines for the Submission and Tabulation of Protests attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference.

## OCEANO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT

## **GUIDELINES FOR THE SUBMISSION AND TABULATION OF PROTESTS**

Where notice of a public hearing with respect to the adoption or increase of a utility charge has been given by the OCSD pursuant to Article XIIID, Section 6(a) of the California Constitution, the following guidelines shall apply.

### **DEFINITIONS**

Unless the context plainly indicates another meaning was intended, the following definitions shall apply in construction of these Guidelines:

- "Parcel" means a piece of land or property identified by Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) that is served by the OCSD, as determined by the San Luis Obispo County Tax Assessor.
- "Record owner" or "parcel owner" means the person or persons whose name or names appear on the San Luis Obispo County Tax Assessor's latest equalized assessment roll as the owner of a parcel.
- A "fee protest proceeding" is not an election, but the General Manager will
  maintain the confidentiality of protests as provided below and will maintain the
  confidentiality and integrity of protests at all times.
- 4. "Public hearing" means the public hearing on the proposed charges.
- 5. "Customer of record" means the person who's name and address appears on the bi-monthly bill. When that is different from the record owner or parcel owner.

## NOTICE OF PROPOSED RATES AND PUBLIC HEARING

- Notice Delivery.
  - A. The OCSD shall give notice of proposed charges, notice of protest process, and public hearing on the proposed charges via 1<sup>st</sup>-class U.S. mail to all record owners and to all customers of record served by the OCSD, effective the date the notice is approved by the Board of Directors, at least Forty-Five (45) days before the date of the public hearing.

- B. The OCSD will mail each notice subject to a request that the U.S. Postal Service provide forwarding address information to the OCSD for any notices forwarded by the U.S. Postal Service.
- C. If the U.S. Postal Service returns any notice to the OCSD as undeliverable and provides the OCSD a forwarding address, the OCSD shall mail the notice to the forwarding address, but its doing so does not extend the time in which protests may be submitted with respect to the proposed charges that are the subject of the public hearing.
- D. The OCSD will provide the notice of proposed charges and public hearing to each record owner and/or record customer who initiates OCSD utility services after the notice is mailed and before the date of the public hearing on the proposed charges, but its doing so does not extend the time in which protests may be submitted with respect to the proposed charges that are the subject of the public hearing.
- E. The OCSD will post the notice of proposed charges and public hearing at its official posting site after the notice is approved by the Board of Directors.

## SUBMISSION OF PROTESTS

## 7. Protest Requirements.

- A. A written protest must include:
  - A statement that it is a protest against the proposed charge which is the subject of the hearing; and
  - (ii) Name of the record owner; and
  - (iii) Identity of the affected parcel by assessor's parcel number or service address; and
  - (iv) Original signature of the record owner with respect to the identified parcel.
- B. Protests shall not be counted if any of the required elements (i thru iv) outlined in the preceding subsection "7.A." are omitted.
- C. A notice of proposed charges may, but need not, include a form by which record owners may note their protest of, or support for, a proposed charge. However, use of such a protest form shall not be required and the OCSD shall accept any protest which complies with these Guidelines.

#### 8. Protest Submittal.

A. Any record owner or customer of record who is subject to the proposed utility charges, which are the subject of the public hearing, may submit a written

protest to the General Manager, at any time before or during the public hearing:

- Delivery to the Oceano Community Services District's Office, at 1655 Front Street Oceano, CA 93475
- Mail to OCSD, Attention: General Manager,
- Post Office Box #599, Oceano, CA 93475
- Personally submitting the protest at the public hearing.
- B. Protests must be received prior to the end of the public hearing, including those mailed to the OCSD. No postmarks will be accepted;
- C. In order to reduce duplicate protests and to avoid fraud, a protest may only be submitted by the record owner or an individual authorized in writing by the record owner. That written authorization shall be provided to the General Manger.
- D. Designated trustees, legal guardians, probate estate executors or administrators, court-appointed or other legal representatives, or property managers/agents of a record owner may file a protest when authorized by the owner of record. Anyone other than the record owner shall provide the General Manager with the written authorization to act in such capacity.
- E. Emailed protests shall not be counted. Only protests with original signatures shall be counted.
- F. Copied protests shall not be counted. Only protests with original signatures shall be counted.
- G. Although oral comments at the public hearing will not qualify as a formal protest unless accompanied by a written protest, the OCSD Board of Directors welcomes input from the community during the public hearing on the proposed charges.

#### 9 Protest Withdrawal

Any person who submits a protest may withdraw it by submitting to the General Manager a signed written request that the protest be withdrawn. The withdrawal of a protest shall identify the affected parcel and the name of the owner of record who submitted both the protest and the request that it be withdrawn.

## 10. Multiple Record Owners or Customers of Record.

- A. Each record owner or customer of record of a parcel served by the OCSD may submit a protest. This includes, but is not limited to, instances where:
  - A parcel is owned by more than a single record owner or more than one name appears on the OCSD's records.

- (ii) Multiple parcels are served via a single utility account such as master-metered condominium units and multiple family residential units.
- B. Only one protest will be counted per parcel.
- C. Any one protest submitted in accordance with these rules will be sufficient to count as a protest for the identified parcel.

### 11. OCSD as Record Owner of Parcel.

Parcels owned by the OCSD that receive utility services, shall not be included in the parcel count for tabulation, or in the count of total numbers of parcels served by the OCSD.

## 12. Transparency, Confidentiality, and Disclosure.

- A. To ensure transparency and accountability in the fee protest tabulation, while protecting the privacy rights of record owners, protests will be maintained in confidence until tabulation begins following the public hearing.
- B. Once a protest is opened during the tabulation, it becomes a disclosable public record, as required by state law.

#### TABULATION OF PROTESTS

### 13. Protest Official.

The OCSD shall retain a neutral third-party with experience as the League of Women Voters or any other Non-Governmental elections official (the Protest Official) to determine the validity of all protests. The Protest Official shall not accept as valid any protest if he or she determines that any of the following conditions exist:

- A. The protest does not state its opposition to the proposed charges.
- B. The protest does not name the record owner or record customer of the parcel identified in the protest, as of the date of the public hearing.
- C. The protest does not identify a parcel served by the OCSD which is subject to the proposed charge.
- D. The protest does not bear an original signature of the named record owner with respect to the parcel identified on the protest. Whether a signature is valid shall be entrusted to the reasonable judgment of the Protest Official, who may review and compare it with signatures on file with the County Elections Official and/or the OCSD. If the signature is questionable, it will be retained for further follow-up with the owner or customer of record. Should the count be close enough that any retained

protest might change it, the Protest Official will mail a notice to the record owner requesting they contact the Protest Official within five (5) business days to verify their signature.

- E. The protest was altered in a way that raises a fair question as to whether the protest actually expresses the intent of a record owner or a customer of record to protest the charges.
- F. The protest was emailed or copied.
- G. The protest was not received by the General Manager before the close of the public hearing on the proposed charges.
- H. The Protest Official's decision that a protest is not valid shall constitute a final administrative action of the OCSD.

## 14. Majority Protest.

- A. A majority protest exists if protests are timely submitted and not withdrawn by the record owner or customers of record with respect to a majority (50% plus one) of the parcels subject to the proposed charge.
- B. The number of parcels with active customer accounts served by the OCSD on the date of the public hearing shall control in determining whether a majority protest exists.
- C. The OCSD will inform the public of the number of parcels served by the OCSD when the notice of proposed charges is mailed.

#### 15. Tabulation of Protests.

At the conclusion of the public hearing, the Protest Official shall tabulate all protests received, including those received during the public hearing, and shall report the results of the tabulation to the OCSD Board of Directors.

## 16. Report of Tabulation.

If at the conclusion of the public hearing the Protest Official determines that he or she will require additional time to tabulate the protests, he or she shall so advise the OCSD Board of Directors, which may continue the meeting to allow the tabulation to be completed on another day or days. If so, the OCSD Board shall declare the time and place of tabulation, which shall be conducted in a place where interested members of the public may observe the tabulation, and the Board shall declare the time at which the meeting shall be resumed to receive and act on the tabulation report of the Protest Official.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

In February 2010 the San Luis Obispo County Air Pollution Control District released the "South County Phase 2 Particulate Study" for public review. The current study is intended as a followup to a Phase 1 study that was finalized in 2007 that showed air quality on the Nipomo Mesa exceeded the state 24-hour PM10 health stand at one or more monitoring locations on over one guarter of the sample days. APCD staff intends to present the above Phase 2 study to the Air Pollution Control Board of Directors on March 24, 2010. The Current Phase 2 study has the potential for far reaching impacts on the Mesa and the Oceano Dunes State Recreational Vehicle Area(ODSRVA). Staff believes that before the Air Pollution Control District Board takes action on the above study California State Parks, who operates ODSRVA, have the opportunity to respond. State Parks is currently in the process of preparing an Environmental Impact Report that is intended to address two major issues. The first is the transfer of property from the County to the State of California and second is a review of continued operations of the ODSRVA Park. In light of this staff recommends the City Council authorize the Mayor to send a letter to the San Luis Obispo County Air Pollution Control District Board of Directors requesting the Board take no action on the above study until State Parks can respond through their current ongoing environmental process.



## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Historical ambient air monitoring on the Nipomo Mesa has documented atypical concentrations of airborne particulate matter compared to other areas of San Luis Obispo County and other coastal areas of California. These historical measurements show that the California health standard for PM10 (airborne particles with a mean aerodynamic diameter of 10 microns or less) is regularly exceeded in many locations on the Nipomo Mesa. Population-based studies in hundreds of cities in the U.S. and around the world have demonstrated that both short-term and long-term exposure to elevated particulate levels can cause significant increases in hospital admissions, emergency room visits, asthma attacks and premature deaths. Groundbreaking long-term studies of children's health conducted in California have also shown that particle pollution may significantly reduce lung function growth in children.

To better understand the extent and sources of these unusually high concentrations of particulate pollution on the Nipomo Mesa, the San Luis Obispo County Air Pollution Control District (SLO APCD) has conducted comprehensive air monitoring studies in that region. The Phase 1 South County Particulate Matter (PM) Study began in 2004 and utilized filter-based manual particulate samplers measuring both PM10 and PM2.5 (particles 2.5 microns in diameter or less) concentrations at 6 monitoring sites located throughout the Mesa. Samples were collected over a one year period and analyzed for mass and elemental composition; meteorological measurements of wind speed and direction were also performed at numerous locations in the study area.

Data from the Phase 1 study showed air quality on the Nipomo Mesa exceeds the state 24-hour PM10 health standard at one or more monitoring locations on over one quarter of the sample days. Elemental analysis of PM2.5 filter samples demonstrated that on these high particulate days, the largest fraction of particles are composed of the wind blown crustal material containing silicon, iron, aluminum, and calcium. Meteorological data showed that high wind events entraining crustal particulate from the dune fields at the Oceano Dunes State Recreational Vehicle Area (SRVA) upwind of the Nipomo Mesa area and transporting them inland as the likely cause; data from a directional PM10 sampler on the Mesa that only operated on high wind days strongly supported this conclusion. Further analysis of Phase 1 study data was unable to provide a conclusive determination on whether off-road vehicle (OHV) activity in the SVRA played a role, either direct or indirect, in the particulate pollution observed on the Nipomo Mesa.

The Phase 1 Study Report was presented to the SLO APCD Board of Directors in March of 2007. The Board directed staff to design and conduct a follow-up study with the primary goal of determining if OHV activity on the SVRA played a role in the high particulate levels measured on the Nipomo Mesa; a secondary goal of the study was to determine what, if any, particulate impacts on the Mesa are due to fugitive dust from the petroleum coke piles at the ConocoPhillips Refinery complex. To help design and conduct the Phase 2 study, the SLO APCD retained the services of the Delta Group, an affiliation of scientists, mostly from the University of California at Davis (UCD), dedicated to the detection and evaluation of aerosol transport. The Great Basin Unified Air Pollution Control District (GBUAPCD), a recognized leader nationwide in understanding and mitigating wind blown particulate pollution, also lent their considerable expertise to the design and implementation of the study. Scientists from the Santa Barbara County APCD, the California Air Resources Board (CARB) and the California State Parks Department also provided significant input in the design phase of the study.

The Phase 2 Study design involved three independent investigations using a broad array of technologies and measurement techniques to better understand the source(s) and activities responsible for the observed particulate pollution problem on the Nipomo Mesa. Determining the role of OHV activity on the SVRA was a key focus of the study, so it was important to conduct measurements and analyses both within and downwind of the dunes at the SVRA, as well within and downwind of "control site" dunes north and south of the SVRA where offroad vehicles are not allowed, to evaluate the differences between them. PM and meteorological measurements downwind of the refinery coke piles and agricultural fields on the Mesa were also a necessary design element to determine potential contributions from those areas. Further, since the Phase 1 study showed that high PM concentrations on the Mesa occur primarily on high wind days, it was critical to ensure that study measurements captured the high wind events that typically occur during the early spring and late fall months.

The field measurement phase of the study was conducted from January 2008 through March 2009. The portion of the study performed by the SLO APCD entailed the deployment and use of real-time particulate monitors and wind sensors at a variety of locations downwind of both the SVRA and the control sites, as well as downwind of the coke piles and agricultural fields. These measurements were designed to assess the relative levels of airborne particulate coming from those areas, particularly on high wind days.

The portion of the study directed by the GBUAPCD involved measuring the amount of sand movement at different wind speeds, both in the SVRA and a control site, to better understand the mechanism and potential source location responsible for wind blown emissions. The Delta Group was responsible for deploying and operating sophisticated research sampling instruments designed to measure the mass, size distribution and elemental composition of the particulate pollution. These samplers were located downwind from the SVRA and a number of control sites that currently do not allow OHV activity. The samplers were also used to look for tracer elements to assess if petroleum coke from the ConocoPhillips refinery facility was being entrained by winds and impacting ambient PM levels in the area. The Delta Group also collected and analyzed soil samples upwind from each monitoring station.

The 3-pronged field investigation effort for the Phase 2 study gathered well over two million data points, requiring nearly a year to review, validate and analyze the data and compile the results. The data analysis was performed by the three independent research groups involved in designing and implementing the study, followed by peer review of the draft study report by a diverse and respected group of scientists with expertise in this field. This wealth of data and critical review of the results by numerous independent experts, combined with the results from the Phase 1 study, provides a much more complete understanding of the particulate pollution problem in the area, leading to the following major findings:

- The airborne particulate matter predominantly impacting the region on high episode days does not originate from an offshore source.
- Neither the petroleum coke piles at the ConocoPhillips facility nor agricultural fields or activities in and around the area are a significant source of ambient PM on the Nipomo Mesa.
- The airborne particulate matter impacting the Nipomo Mesa on high episode days
  predominantly consists of fine sand material transported to the Mesa from upwind areas
  under high wind conditions.

- The primary source of high PM levels measured on the Nipomo Mesa is the open sand sheets in the dune areas of the coast.
- The open sand sheets subject to OHV activity on the SVRA emit significantly greater amounts of particulates than the undisturbed sand sheets at the study control sites under the same wind conditions.
- Vegetated dune areas do not emit wind blown particles; the control site dunes have significantly higher vegetation coverage than is present at the SVRA.

The major findings resulting from detailed analysis of the diverse and comprehensive data sets generated during the Phase 1 and Phase 2 South County PM Studies clearly lead to a definitive conclusion: OHV activity in the SVRA is a major contributing factor to the high PM concentrations observed on the Nipomo Mesa.

There are two potential mechanisms of OHV impact. The first is direct emissions from the vehicles themselves, which includes fuel combustion exhaust and/or dust raised by vehicles moving over the sand. Elemental analysis of study data shows combustion exhaust particles are not a significant component in the samples during high concentration periods. However, analysis of SVRA vehicle activity data does show a weak relationship between high PM10 concentrations and high vehicle activity. This indicates a very small direct emissions impact from OHV activity caused by wind entrainment of dust plumes raised by vehicles moving across the open sand. While significant, the study data shows this is not the major factor responsible for the high PM levels downwind from the SVRA.

The second potential mechanism of impact from OHV activities involves indirect emission impacts. Offroad vehicle activity on the dunes is known to cause de-vegetation, destabilization of dune structure and destruction of the natural crust on the dune surface. All of these act to increase the ability of winds to entrain sand particles from the dunes and carry them to the Mesa, representing an indirect emissions impact from the vehicles. The data strongly suggests this is the primary cause of the high PM levels measured on the Nipomo Mesa during episode days.

# DECLARATION OF FAILURES AND CALL FOR IMMEDIATE DISMISSAL OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT OF OCEANO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT AND SUPPORT OF RECALL OF DISTRICT DIRECTORS WHO OPPOSE IT submitted on December 9, 2009

In view of the fact that in recent months it has come to the public's knowledge that:

- 1. since the District's inception, and until recently, cash has been received by the OCSD front desk without any method of securing those cash payments from theft (i.e. no safe);
- 2. actual check numbers do not match the check numbers given to the Board on the warrants lists, thus making tracking virtually impossible;
- checks for large sums of monies have been issued but not cashed and no followup has been reported to the auditor despite their request;
- 4. the District is behind in its annual audits, and information requested by the auditor has repeatedly not been provided;
- 5. checks have been issued without any warrants;
- 6. warrants have been issued without invoices;
- 7. information regarding annual budgets have not been provided to the Board of Directors in a timely manner, thus having them have to operate without an approved budget for months;
- 8. it has been found that for Director Dahl's 1099's, three of six years were corrected, but the numbers don't add up to what the warrants show as paid, and the numbers reported on the 1099's are below what the warrants add up to;
- 9. cell phones paid by the District have not been reported on 1099's;
- 10. 1099's for 2008 reportedly cannot be found;
- 11. the District incurred IRS fines and penalties in 2005, with no report of it made to the Board of Directors;
- 12. a penalty was paid to the IRS in June 2009 by overpaying the quarterly payroll tax instead of reporting it as a separate line item to be approved by the Board of Directors and appropriately disclosed on public records;
- 13. it was reported to the Board of Directors that the District's umbrella insurance policy was being cancelled, when in fact, what was NOT reported was that the District's entire liability insurance policy is being cancelled effective January 2010;
- 14. repeated requests by the public and members of the Board of Directors for an update of the reserve accounts were not provided for several months;

- 15. department budgets have not been reported on a monthly basis, thus making it virtually impossible for any department to know the status of their budget on a month-to-month basis and operate fiscally responsibly;
- 16. telephone records indicate that the administrative assistant's District-provided cell phone has been used to download music for personal use and paid with public funds;

the above failures to perform for the interest of the people of Oceano are, at best, indicators of gross negligence in the performance of duties required by, and requested of, the administrative assistant, if not worse. Perhaps a forensic audit will reveal more, if we ever get enough board members to take their fiscal responsibility to the people of Oceano seriously enough to order one. Members of this Board of Directors have opposed a forensic audit to bring to light what's been going on with the finances of this district.

Given all the above, I morally have no choice but to, on behalf of the people of Oceano, call for the immediate dismissal of the current administrative assistant and support the immediate recall from Oceano Community Service District's Board of Directors, any director who supports the administrative assistant by using the privilege of their office to oppose, and/or obstruct, such dismissal.
